TIPS AND TRICKS FOR MAKING

HOMEMADE BATH BOMBS

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EASY ON THE OIL

Less is more when it comes to using oil-based additives. Too much oil can stop the bath bombs from hardening. Remember to use oil additives sparingly.

KEEP THE MOLDS DRY

Keep the molds away from water and other wet ingredients to prevent your bath bomb from getting stuck in the molds. Dry it off before pouring in your bath bomb mixture just to to be safe.

HUMIDITY MATTERS

Pay attention to humidity and don't make your bath bombs near a steamy kitchen. Too much moisture in the air can cause bath bombs to expand and fizz prematurely.

PATIENCE IS KEY

It's absolutely necessary to let your bath bomb set for at least several hours. However, it's best to leave them in the mold overnight.

SMOOTH BATH BOMBS?

There's nothing worse than a bath bomb that comes out lumpy and unappealing. Use cornstarch as 1/4 of the overall content of your dry ingredients for smooth bath bombs.

6MONTHS TO USE

Use your bath bomb within 6 months for the best results. The longer you wait, the

more likely it will be exposed to moisture and lose its fizziness.
